

A. Search and Browse Functions

The Search and Browse functions provide Keyword; Article Title; Index Term and Boolean queries, as well as Browsing by Publisher; Title; LCSH; format or ISBN.

B. Instant Display of E-books Only

Limit queries to e-books only. The default search is for all formats, permitting patrons to see your entire reference collection, regardless of format.

C. Show Non-Local Results

An invaluable utility for collection development applications, weeding or relocation, this one-click option permits staff to identify titles for consideration.

D. Each Title Linked to Your Local Catalog

This feature unlocks the holdings in your own catalog in a way your OPAC query cannot, because *Reference Universe* matches at the *index* entry level, not just subject or title level. Your major reference works now see increased usage across formats.

E. Saving Items, E-mailing, Downloading

Saving Selected Items permits you to export or email a large number of citations. You can export titles in *Brief*, *Full*, *RefWorks* or *EndNotes* format.

F. Library Identification and Link

Your library's logo will appear throughout the *Reference Universe* display. This logo can be linked to LibGuides, Ask-a-Librarian, or any page at your library site.

G. Rapid Delivery of E-Content


Reference Universe permits researchers to see links at the Article Title or Index-level entry, and/or access the e-book through use of the library's OpenURL resolver.

H. Refine Search via Library of Congress Subject Headings

This feature permits restricting queries by LCSH, but also reveals the breadth of content within *Reference Universe* beyond the confines of presumed subject queries. This is vital for extracting the most from your own reference collection

I. Search Options (not visible here)

The display defaults to 20 citations, but options for 30 and 50 items are available here. Additional search options here include Exact Words, Exact Phrase and Boolean operators.
